

George was born in Denver at St. Joe's hospital.

His wife Twyla and two daughters were born there as well.
His father was a Denver cop, and the head of the vice squad for 19 years. It was during this time that George first heard the name "Fred Pasternack."

George is a DPS product, and took the bus from Her-

shey Park to West High School for the second session classes from 12:30 - 5:00 pm, which taught him some bad sleeping habits. After one cold winter in Gunnison attending Western State college, he transferred to CU, where he earned a degree in cultural anthropology. This was 1967, and George was drafted the next month.

After training he emerged as a 1st Lieutenant infan-

try, and was then sent to Korea, rather than Vietnam, for one year. Putting his cultural anthropology degree to good use, George came back to Denver and took the first job he could find: reading meters for Public Service Company. That turned into a 38-year career with Public Service, then Xcel Energy. He spent 12 years as the head of the Customer Service Department, and another 12 years as the Human Resources Director.

On March 30<sup>th</sup>, George and Twyla will celebrate 49 years of marriage. They have a daughter who is a food scientist for Quaker Oats (a division of Pepsi), and a second daughter who has her PhD in orchestral conducting. She lives in Newport Beach, CA, and works for the Pacific Symphony. George's Optimist Club career began when a VP at Public Service made him join the Optimist Club of Civic Center in 1982. He is still in that club, which has 6 members, all of whom are active. He has also been in the Denver Tech Center Club for 20 years. George joined MSOC in 2005. He has served as District Secretary four times, and was Governor in 2007/2008. George is clearly filled with the spirit of Optimism and the Optimist creed. He also believes in the Hindu philosophy: "You can't take it with you when you go, but hide it - you'll be back."
