#### Speaker

Our speaker today was Jane Howell, Executive Director of the Colorado State Office of Judicial Performance Evaluation.

After asking several warm up questions, like:

- How many know which judicial district you are in? (Answer: Nobody.)
- How many lawyers in the room? (Answer: Too many!)

Ms. Howell said that, in colonial times, judges were appointed by the King and stayed on the bench at the King's whim. Subsequent to colonial times, and to avoid hassles, federal judges were appointed by the President, for life terms. State judges were generally appointed by their respective state's Governor. Some states chose to have judges elected by popular vote, which resulted in many judges being selected for their political acumen, as opposed to their excellence in jurisprudence. Our current system (at least in Colorado) is a hybrid of the two systems whereby judges are appointed by appropriate authorities, but the people in the various judicial districts get to vote on whether judge is retained.

Jane said that Colorado's judicial evaluation system is model and that her office gets many calls from other states on how to develop the excellence exhibited by our system. The system includes commissions for each judicial district in Colorado (22 in all). The commissions consist of both attorneys and non-attorneys, who are appointed by the Governor, Chief Justice, Speaker of the House and the President of the Senate. There are 10 members on each of the 22 commissions throughout the state. In response to the observation that, rarely in the "Blue Book" or on the website, are there any judges who are not recommended for retention, Ms. Howell responded that frequently, when a judge is made aware of the fact that the recommendation of the committee is not to retain them, that judge chooses not to stand for retention and simply resigns from the bench. She also said that, the various commissions work with judges, especially newly appointed ones, on developmental plans. This is done to avail new judges of the opportunity to improve their skills, while making them aware of the need for improvement in certain areas.

Since the Commission was created in 1988, approximately 1,210 citizens have participated on commissions within their own judicial districts. Nine hundred and forty-nine names of judges have appeared on the ballot. There have been:

- 15 recommendations to not retain.
- 10 "No Opinions."
- 7 judges have not been retained by voters.

Ms. Howell reminded us of our duty to vote to ensure that "The Voice of the People is Heard."
