Ellie is also the Captain of *Ellie's Diabetes Busters* Walk Team that walks and raises money at every annual JDFR Family and Friends Fun Walk. Her team has raised over \$65,000. OCMS members John Oss and Paul Simon are regulars at the walk. Monaco South has also been contributing over the years. It costs \$1500 to send each child to Summer Camp and with financial support from JDRF the cost is reduced to \$600.

TI-DOC steps in and pays half the cost and as a result 30 kids were able to attend this year. Note: A Medical Staff is also on site for assistance as well. Over \$50,000 has been raised by TI-DOC to date and untold hours by volunteers have been added to the ongoing effort to help kids with diabetes.
