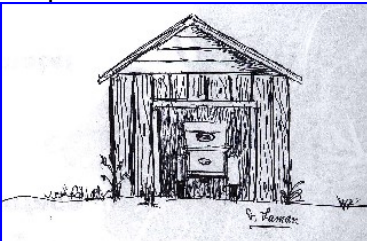
Good Morning Optimist

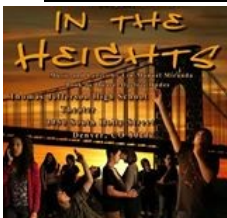
know the names designated in Level IV under "Knowledge of Organization." Check it off!

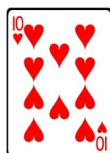
Wednesday, March 19 and runs through Saturday the 22nd. See John for more details and tickets.
