Cochlear Kids Camp

Our speakers today were Melissa Francis and Judith Stucky from the Colorado Neurological Institute (CNI) Center for Hearing, which Monaco South Optimist Club supports the Cochlear Camp for Kids.



CNI is a nonprofit research and charitable institute located on the campus of Swedish Medical Center in Englewood, CO. Under the leadership of Medical Director David Kelsall, MD, the CNI Center for Hearing has become one of the leading facilities in the United States for cochlear implantation and for charitable work with the hearing impaired community. The center was started in 1989, by doctors who wanted to give more than traditional medicine, to patients. The organization offers a wide variety of services and programs. These include Patient Care, Education, Active Research Projects, and Outreach.

Cochlear implants are surgically implanted devices that provide hearing to patients with certain types of severe to profound loss. This can include loss in both ears (bilateral) or one ear (unilateral), are FDA approved and are appropriate for patients 1 to 100 years old. The

costs of the implants can be more than \$65,000; however, studies have shown that lifetime costs to society for a deaf individual are an estimated \$1 million. The institute's goal is to provide implants and systems to qualified applicants through partnerships with device manufacturers. To date, more than 40 of these systems have been placed throughout the country.

To date, CNI Center for Hearing has hosted 16 camps here in Colorado. Total participant count is nearly 3,000 and includes families from 41 states and Canada. Families and kids become aware that they are not alone in their struggle and can bond friendships with others sharing the journey. The camp cost is subsidized for the families and it is this support that is dearly needed.


