Guest Speaker

President and CEO of Mental Health America of Colorado, Donald Mares

Our Guest Speaker was a returning guest speaker, this time as President and CEO of Mental Health America of Colorado. Mr. Donald J. Mares.

Don shared with us a very touching story. As Colorado's former Director of the Department of Labor and Employment, he witnessed the collapse of the economy and spiraling unemployment rates first hand. Many, many, people suffered with their losses, and mental illnesses were no exceptions. Mental Health America was a natural segue for Don.

According to Don, Mental Health America creates opportunities for all Coloradans to achieve mental wellness. Their programs educate people about mental health conditions, provide outreach to people in need and advocate for improved health care in our state. They

exist as a community resource for people seeking information about mental health and as a team player as they collaborate with others to improve health care in Colorado. Some of these programs are:

Suicide Prevention—Colorado consistently ranks in the top 10 ten states for high suicide rate. MHAC brings people together to develop initiatives that save lives.

Check Your Head—East High School students perform at Check Your Head assembly. The program uses elements

of hip hop to address issues such as self identity, peer pressure, depression and suicide.

Pro Bono Outreach—MHAC understands that language is a barrier to mental health treatment. MHAC volunteers lead an interpreter training to expand access to treatment for Spanish speakers.

We Can! Recognizing advocacy efforts that advance mental health and reduce stigma.

MHAC envisions a healthy Colorado free of stigma and discrimination where every person has full access to high quality services for all mental health and substance abuse conditions.

There is a lot of Mental Health help available - it is Don's and MHAC's wish that it gets used.

And for all of you CSU Ram fans—CSU is the first school in the state to use MHAC's services. Student/Residence Assistants and Food Service personnel are being trained to recognize changes in behavior that may represent early detection of a mental illness. Way to go Rams!
