## MS Bike Ride Recap, by your editor

Day one. Under a cloudy sky, 3,100 riders headed out June 28<sup>th</sup> for the annual bike ride for Multiple Sclerosis, formerly the MS-150. We started early and reached the Front Range Community College (FRCC) by 5:00 am, our VIP parking pass allowed us to park close to the food and starting line. Missed the 5:15 am breakfast with **Jake Rife** and **Howard Fry**, but saw them at the first rest stop and everyone seems in high spirits. The first part of the course saw some rolling hills and a chance for the heart and legs to get warmed up. Thank goodness for the clouds. At rest stop #2 your editor met Allen Pierce who was riding with the Motley Spokes riding team and a recent new member to MSOC. The course wound through Niwot and into the countryside of farms and ranches. The smell of the air was fresh and it felt crisp as we cruised into Hygiene, a lovely little town for our next rest stop. Thirty some miles into the ride and the feeling was good!

After the lunch stop near Longmont, we saw the crowds begin to build and as the lines for services continued to grow, the scope of the event becomes a bit clearer. This is a major event for the MS Society and the goal to raise \$3 million, which indicates the work that goes into fund-raising of this size. The clouds begin to leave and a warm sun greets us for the afternoon's ride. We past beautiful Carter Lake and pristine pasture as we continued on. The legs are feeling a bit weary as we make our way into the south entrance of Horsetooth Reservoir, again we marvel at this state's beauty. Coming out we get to coast into Fort Collins and bike the last remaining miles in a cruising gear. There, the finish of the first

day, and volunteers and family members greet the riders as they finish the first day's effort. What a great day!

Day two greets us with cool and clear weather and breakfast, supplied by the food service department of CSU. It included eggs, sausage, yogurt, fruit, juice, and coffee to fill the tank before we headed out. The route very nearly retraces the steps we took yesterday with one exception being the lunch stop manned by the Monaco South and **Tamarac Optimists**. We enjoyed great food, picture taking from our own Craig Eley, an excellent live band, and support from the members. The rest stop included medical supplies as well as water and refueling for the ride ahead. What a great rest stop! MSOC along with the Tamarac ladies have a wonderful reputation for putting on a well staffed, fun, and important resting point for the second day of the ride. Its place on this fundraising bike ride is important not only for the comfort it supplies, but also for the energy and positive affirmation it provides to all the riders. Well done!

We then travel on towards Boulder, weaving our way in and about rural, commercial, and residential areas. It was an interesting mix and helped take my mind off the sore parts of the body that were constantly cropping up. After 78 miles on day two the site of the FRCC campus was a welcome one, with more food and plenty of stories to relive. The 2008 version was a great one and the Monaco South and Tamarac Optimist Clubs should be proud of the role they played in making it a success. Thanks to one and all!




