With the recitation of the *Optimist Creed* we go out to this beautiful day and spread the word of Optimism.



Live Kidney Donation Presented by Mike McMahon & Kim Margolis

Mike talks about his recent donation of a kidney to his neighbor Kimberly Margolis. Kimberly tells us that 26 years ago she was diagnosed with a kidney disease. This diagnosis has had some positive results, she developed a healthy lifestyle, and paid special attention to doing everything she could to help her body fight the disease. Six months ago, she was told that her kidneys were failing and Mike McMahon, left, tells his story and then to a pre-screening psychologist that he would that she needed a donor organ transplant immediate.

The surgery took place early in the morning and Mike was told his portion of the procedure would take between 92-96 minutes. The process of inserting Mike's kidney into Kimberly lasted for 2½ hours. After both were released from the hospital they recovered at Kimberly's house—Mike's home was undergoing major renovation at the same time and was inhabitable. The recovery process went well and Mike's determination to return quickly to work and exercise regimen did, in fact, happen. Kimberly also had a strong belief in a positive outcome mindset and her recovery has progressed well.

The psychological aspect of organ donation are complicated and both Mike and Kimberly discussed this aspect. Kim talked about the feelings recipients have regarding a gift of this magnitude and how they can process this in a healthy way. Altruism or selflessness is the practice of concern for the welfare of others. How that offering is received is an aspect Kimberly chose to accept in the spirit with which it was given. By continuing to live, her life with a positive spirit and healthy practice ensures that her new kidney will allow her to thrive.

During the questions that followed, we learned that this disease is not genetic, so Regan, Kimberly's daughter, is not susceptible to it. Kimberly's insurance covered the great majority of the costs and Mike did not incur any financial obligation. Mike's new employer was very understanding, further reinforcing his belief that his decision to take the new job was the correct one. One new development that has Kimberly intrigued is her increased appetite and a sweet tooth that she has developed. Dr.'s think that because her failing kidneys caused her system to become so toxic, the new organ has allowed a better ability to taste and gives her body the ability to process the nutrients.
