David Lazaroff is a member of our club and is a Systems Architect at the U.S. Geological Survey. He loves to coach family and friends of persons with the dreaded Alzheimer's disease, helping them connect with the joy that is available in life. David is the author of "Live It Up! Share a Great Life With Alzheimer's, Cancer, or Any Diagnosis." His life was changed in 2004 when Carl, a 60 year old acquaintance, was diagnosed with Alzheimer's Disease. Through his journey with Carl, David came to operate a small assisted living home, and founded the Colorado non-profit, Holistic Community Living, with the purpose to operate and teach others to operate neighborhood based holistic assisted living homes. These are homes where people can complete their lives in their neighborhood, near their family, friends and social organizations.

David offered a new perspective on what it means, and does not mean, when someone you know is diagnosed with

Alzheimer's. He shared five (5) ways to share joy when this happens.

- 1. A sense of humor. Know what it is, use it.
- 2. Hold hands. Physical connection is important.
- 3. Food. Enjoy it together.
- 4. Energy. Bring energy to the visit. Have a great life to give a great life.
- 5. Music. Know their favorites. Listen together, go to concerts together.
