

Ron Cisco writes: JERRY WHITLOW was a devoted husband, beloved father, and dedicated friend. Jerry was born in Louisville, KY on March 25, 1945. He was raised in Northglenn, CO and graduated from Northglenn High School.

Jerry was an entrepreneur having worked in various lines of business most recently working in the gaming business in Las Vegas, NV.

Jerry and Kathy raised her two daughters in and around the Denver area and before leaving Colorado in 1993 lived in Arvada, CO. Jerry loved the two girls and thought of them as his own. He talked often of taking part in all of their activities. Jerry and Kathy loved traveling, especially to Hawaii. Jerry had a magnificent singing voice and Kathy would accompany him on the piano. They traveled all over Europe on a singing tour with the Arvada Chorale. This was one of jerry's fondest memories.

Jerry was a dedicated Optimist. He was a charter member of Monaco South and served as its charter

Secretary/Treasure in 1976. The next year he was the President of Monaco South. He served the Colorado/Wyoming district on many committees and was the District Secretary/Treasure during my Administration in 1991/1992. He was elected to Governor Elect in 1993.

Jerry was a close friend to many at Monaco South but was especially close with me. As partners in 1991/1992 we spent a lot of time together in leading the Colorado/Wyoming District to one of the most successful years in history. Rest in peace Jerry.

There will not be any service. Jerry requested cremation and that his remains be scattered in Maui as this was a place that he had visited many times.
