Diabetes Prevention Program (Type 2): Ron Gustas invited OCMS members to be guests at the next T1DOC meeting to be held on Wednesday, January 8th starting at 6:30 p.m. at the Perkins Restaurant located at 1995 South Colorado Blvd. The meeting speaker will be a YMCA representative who will talk about their Diabetes Prevention Program (Type 2). The program starts with 16 weekly sessions and then continues monthly for a year to help anyone either at risk for or having Type 2 Diabetes, which can be reversed by lifestyle changes including healthier eating and increased physical activity. Over 13,000 participants have attended the program at YMCA and other sites. The program is fee based with some insurance carriers providing benefits.
