Ron Gustas introduced our speaker Robert Garelick, the Juvenile Diabetes Research Foundation Executive Director. Robert expressed thanks to the whole club for the support received at the JDRF walk and other events every year.

JDRF is a volunteer driven organization, and Robert was a board of directors volunteer when his son was diagnosed with diabetes at age 4. Today, October 22nd, is his son's "diaversary" day (anniversary of his diagnosis). He is now an 18 year old studying at CU.

Type 1 diabetics deal with a day-to-day life that is annoying, and long-term effects are the worry. JDRF is geared to help make life easier now, while investing in research

to solve long-term complications. JDRF has a target goal of

82 cents of every \$1 going to research, which is a very efficient percentage for a non-profit. Fortune Magazine has named them a five star charity, based largely on that efficiency. JDRF provides funding to the Barbara Davis Center, National Jewish, and Children's Hospital locally. They raise money through individuals as well as events, i.e., walks, a ski event in Aspen, and an annual Gala event.
