Paul Bernard introduced Don Eley founder of *Brent's Place*, a facility near Anschutz Medical Campus at the new Children's Hospital in Aurora. Brent's Place is designed to offer families "Safe-Clean" individualized



housing in an environment virtually free from dander, dust, mold and other infectious agents.

Brent's Place, a program and facility created by the Brent Eley Foundation, bridges the gap between the hospital and going home, providing Hospital Housing for young cancer patients and their parents. Brent's Place is the only hospital approved facility to provide a "safe-clean" facility for immune compromised patients. Don Eley's son was a cancer victim and has been Don's driving force to develop this facility. The first apartment unit was built in1998 at the first facility downtown, which has five units and which serves pa-
