Speaker, Marie Connolly Guiding Light, Patient Advocacy

Marie Connolly is the founder of Guiding Light, LLC. Marie is a Denver native who has been involved with



health care for many years. As a nurse, she has seen firsthand the lapses in healthcare that can lead to serious consequences and even death. She started Guiding Light because she felt that every patient needs an advocate to ensure that they re-

ceive timely and proper care. Some points that Marie made during her presentation:

- Take someone with you when you visit a doctor and take notes. Statistics show that patients forget 40-80% of what is said by the health practitioner. Ask questions until you totally understand what is being said.
- Each hospital is staffed with professional patient advocates (usually 2 or 3), but each advocate may have as many as 80 to 100 patients to look after. Once you leave the hospital, it is difficult to get any assistance.
- Advanced Directives are frequently ignored by hospital staff because they do not want to become involved with the in-fighting that goes on with patients' relatives.
- There is a glitch in Medicare that will not allow payments for rehabilitation unless you have been hos-

pitalized for three overnights, so if you or your loved one is released without having spent three nights, you may have to pay out of pocket for rehab.

- There are frequent screw ups on medication, either because the doctor is unaware of other medications or is just plain not paying attention. Make sure you furnish the doctor with a current list of meds you are taking and check prescriptions to make sure they have been filled properly.
- The simplest, most cost effective measure you can take when hospitalized is to take your own alcohol based hand sanitizer and make sure that both staff and visitors use it while handling anything which you might later come in contact with. Don't be afraid to call to attention of staff that they need to wash their hands. Infections are frequently a result of failure to wash hands and cause millions of dollars (and some deaths).
- Because most of us don't have enough knowledge to advocate for ourselves, professional patient advocates are worth the money. Costs run around \$125/hour or between \$1200 and \$1500 for each case
