Tree Lot Update: Craig Eley announced to all, that the Tree Lot comes to life today, November 28<sup>th</sup> and anyone who has time is requested to help set up the Lot. Next weekend, starting December 6<sup>th</sup> the Santa Haus will be opening weekends throughout December. Tamarac Optimist ladies will be on site to help price and tag the trees. Scott Walker will lead the charge drilling holes in the bases. New Christmas Holiday CD's have been acquired and there is great hope that the TV will be up and running by Sunday. It was also mentioned that we still need Santa volunteers for the weekend shifts.

Joe Marci reported that the first delivery of trees would be approximately 330, followed by two more deliveries totaling 1,000 or so. Our goal for the year is a little over 1,000 sales. Mike Miller will be handling the deliveries of trees, wreaths, garland, supplies, and mistletoe. We have been issued our city permits and Gary Miller will be in charge of the generator and related electrical issues. Tree donations will go out to ten Denver Public Schools for decorating and delivery to families in need. We will again have a drawing for a free tree to capture customer email addresses. Club members are not eligible and are again reminded TIPS belong to the Club. We sent out 900 mails from last year's customer entries and encourage every customer to enter the drawing. Our target is for a net profit again this year. WE CAN DO THIS!
