



Peter van Dernoot The Children's Treehouse Foundation

Prez Paul Simon made the introduction of our speaker this morning, Peter van Dernoot, is the Exec-

utive Director of the Children's Treehouse Foundation, Click for Information, and the author of "Helping Your Children Cope With Your Cancer: A Guide for Parents and Families" and "Talking with My Treehouse Friends about: An Activity Book for Children of Parents with Cancer."

Peter related the story of his personal tragedy and shared the birthing and success of project CLIMB, which

stands for Children's Lives Include Moments of Bravery, a free six-week program that provides support to children ages 5 through 12 who have a parent or other loved one touched by cancer. Half of men and a third of women can expect cancer during their lives. However, cancer is caught sooner now and life expectancies are increasing.

Peter's wife Alice was 41 when she got cancer. They did not know how to handle the children's concerns. Within three years, she was gone. Then Peter found a project at Porter Hospital. The project addressed the concerns of the children of cancer patients. It was a three-year-old program, successful in

removing the guilt of the children.

The Children's Treehouse Foundation was established. Within that foundation. CLIMB was established. The children get past their guilt and their stress levels go down. With the children's stress level down the stress is less for the cancer patient and the family. It is a win -win.

The CLIMB program is now operating in 29 states. There are candidate health professionals in the remaining 21 states. Recruiting and

training health professionals can extend the program to the entire country. At the end of three years we can have 10% of the nation's children covered. Peter invites us to join in the cause.
