Gerry's other passion for over 40 years before he retired. Gerry is now living at St. Andrew's Village in Aurora.

By the way, a recent note from Gerry's daughter (Jackie Dobrovolny) says, "Dad is doing well at St. Andrew's and is participating in lots of activities. He likes to get out for a few hours and I keep encouraging him to go to all of the exercise and walking sessions. We noticed that Friday, Saturday, and Sunday are pretty boring, i.e., St. Andrew's does not offer very many activities or outings.
