He and his mother were there the "Night of Broken Glass," on November 9, 1938. They were protected by an armed guard as those recognized as Jews were swept off to concentration camps. Tom will be speaking at that theater October 15<sup>th</sup>. Tom has "forgotten the mistakes of the past" and recommends that all "press on."

Tom has traveled for 3 months twice each year to the Czech Republic ever since the iron curtain came down. He presented his experiences to MSOC this

past July (Click here to see the recap in the July 10 issue of GUMS). Tom is one of the 669 Winton Train children. This will be his last trip. His wife Caroline's health is waning. Tom is the greatest example of an optimist I ever expect to know.

Hugh O'Brian Youth (HOBY) Foundation which was founded in 1958 to "inspire and develop our global community of youth and volunteers to a life dedicated to leadership, service and innovation." Paul is one of the prime organizers of HOBY in Colorado and has served on the board of directors for the past several years.

HOBY's flagship program, the State Leadership Seminar, allows high school

sophomores to recognize their leadership talents and apply them in becoming effective, ethical leaders in their home, school, workplace and community. Students attend three- or four-day seminars and participate in hands-on leadership activities, meet leaders in their state, and explore their own personal leadership skills while learning how to make a positive impact in their community. The seminar curriculum is based on the Social Change Model of Leadership and develops leadership from three perspectives: Personal Leadership, Group Leadership, and Leadership for Society.

All schools (including home schooling associations) registered within Colorado receive invitations to attend, although some choose not to because of financial constraints or other exigencies. Mostly through Paul's efforts, 22 partici-

pants, who might not otherwise have been able to attend the 2015 Colorado Leadership Seminar, were sponsored by various Optimist Clubs within Colorado. There is no cost to the students who attend, but schools must pay a registration fee of \$195, which means some of the poorer school districts need some help with donations.

This year's conference will, once again, be held on the University of Denver campus. As a part of the Leadership for Society segment of the conference, groups of students meet with volunteers

from the community to examine the aspects and the importance of community service. According to Paul, this is where members from our club can provide invaluable information to these young leaders by participating in one on one conversations and group discussions at the Saturday evening meal, which is usually a barbeque cookout, held on the DU campus.

Paul will be happy to discuss any aspects of HOBY, but hopes that you will consider participating in this valuable experience for the young leaders of tomorrow. Exact dates have not yet been established, but Paul will keep us up to date on when and where as the date (usually in the first or second week in June) approaches.
