Boy Scouts of America Alumni Connection

Paul Bernard beckoned **Donlie Smith** to introduce our Guest Speakers; Nathan Baie and Jim Blair, of the Council Commission Board of Trustees proceeded to take us on a journey of the 100-year anniversary celebration of the Boy Scouts. Jim has been involved with the Boy Scouts for over 45 years. Jim asked everyone who was involved with the Boy

Scouts to raise their hand and 95% of the room held up their hands. He went on to explain that the Boy Scouts were focused on electing 12 new members from the area to the Hall of Leadership for the purpose of serving

youth in the community. The Boy Scout vision is based on character building. Over 20,000 in the Public School system in Colorado are influenced and guided by the Boy Scouts. It was also noted that another 20,000 girls between the ages of 14 to 20 are also involved programs promulgated by the Boy Scouts. One interesting statistic is that 90% of Boy Scout participants graduate from High School in DPS.

Nathan Baie reported Colorado has two camps: One in Colorado Springs, Peaceful Valley, and the other in the Allen's Park area, Camp Tahosa.

Colorado is the home of the 5th largest council in the U.S. It is estimated that as a result of the Eagle Scout program and the projects attached thereto generate over \$2.1 million annually. The Annual awards dinner sponsored, in part, by MSOC and Chaired by our own **Donlie Smith** had over 700 attendees. Nathan went on to say that Charter Sponsorships for Eagle Scout projects are available and can be viewed at their website. Family commitment and support is one of the main elements of the success of Boy Scouts.

There are 120 achievement badges that can be earned by a Boy Scout. The 2010 "Opportunities to Win" patches are the keystone of achievement. The National Jamboree will be held this year at Fort A.P. Hill, near Bowling Green, Va. And Closing Night Ceremonies will be broadcast to area Council's and Troops, plus to

Dick's Sports Park. <u>The Taste of Colorado</u> on Sept 3-6th will feature a 10,000 sq. ft. venue that includes the Boy Scouts 40' tractor-trailer exhibition hall. This is the only stop in Denver.
