#### Wayne Williams Colorado Secretary of State

Introduced by Frank Middleton, our speaker today was Wayne Williams, Secretary of State for the State of Colorado. Also in attendance was his Communications Director, Lynn Bartels.

Mr. Williams, who graduated with honors from Brigham Young University and earned his law degree from the University of Virginia has worked his way up to his current position, serving in various capacities in El Paso County and was elected to his current position with more votes than any Secretary of State in the history of Colorado. In addition to Colorado Secretary of State. his position with the State of Colorado, he

operates a law practice specializing in small business issues and teaches employment law seminars across the country.

Wayne Williams said although most people know that the Secretary of State's office is involved with elections and business licensing, "...few realize that we also certify candidates, track political contributions, help state agencies implement new laws, regulate lobbyists, certify and oversee notaries, regulate bingo and raffles, license and advise nonprofits, and more." All this is accomplished with a staff of 130 employees.

From the pamphlet distributed by Mr. Williams' office, it states. "In a nutshell, the Colorado Secretary of State's office protects the rights and services the dreams of Coloradans. We do this by focusing on citizens, business owners and nonprofit managers—answering their questions and

solving their problems with personable and innovative customer service. Our purpose is to protect Colorado elections and to make this state the friendliest in the country to nonprofits and businesses."

During a Q&A session following his formal presentation, Mr. Williams answered questions about the caucus system in Colorado and said that not having a primary election saves the state about \$5 million. He also explained that, in order to ensure people, vote appropriately, his office purges the records through information obtained from various agencies, including Colorado Department of

Motor Vehicles, Social Security, US Postal Service, Department of Corrections and others.

He is proud of the fact that it is easy and convenient to do most business in an online environment, including iPhone applications, and the fact that he has made it easier for the armed services to vote and has extended the voting deadline for those troops stationed outside of the state.
