TODAY'S SPEAKER

Freddie introduced our speaker, Reverend Leon Kelly who spoke to us about the gang problems in Denver. He mentioned that he had talked to us a year or so ago and that some changes have occurred. Rev. Kelly has been working gang issues for over 22 years and summarized that time by saying that every 7 years something significant seems to happen. In 1986 there were riots, in 1993 we had the summer of violence, in 2000 he endured a personal tragedy when his nephew was shot and this year the Darent Williams murder. In the intervening years we have seen a gradual upswing in gang activity with some ups and downs.

Rev. Kelly said there were many open cases in 2006 (as well as the Williams case) and asked, "Why no arrests". The answer is that although the police may have suspects, there is a lack of witnesses due to intimidation resulting in concern for personal and family safety. He mentioned that a gang cancer plagues major cities and is a national problem and that gang members are migrating between cities. While historically northeast Denver was predominantly a black gang problem, now there is a clash of cultures between Latinos and blacks and this violence is increasing.

Rev. Kelly runs a program in northeast Denver that attracts over 100 kids between 3:00 and 6:00 p.m. Monday through Thursday. Resources and mentors are always needed for this very important program.
