




A Night with Benjamin Franklin and Friends

On Thursday night, January 17, at North High School a lively and spunky Dr. Benjamin Franklin (aka Chris Lowell) celebrated his 302nd birthday with a large group of assorted well wishers, students and close friends.

The evening event was a special Liberty Day fundraiser organized and managed by South Denver Optimist President John Wren, emceed by fellow member David Fogel and sponsored in part by the Optimist Clubs of South Denver and Monaco South. District Governor George Buzick was on hand to lead the opening ceremonies by assisting in a group recital of the Optimist Creed, followed by the Pledge of Allegiance (sadly, there was no cry of "Play Ball"). Other Monaco South members in attendance included President Greg and Diane Young, Fred and Karen Pasternack (who donated \$100 to the cause), Liberty Day Executive Director Andy McKean and Phil Perington. City Auditor Dennis Gallagher also attended, but politely kept the orations to a reasonable minimum.

Franklin was incredibly engaging, spending the better part of the first hour giving a colorful tutorial traversing his childhood accomplishments. memories, business assorted political shenanigans, and finally, the evolution and signing of the Declaration of Independence. This led to the intriguing tale of his journey to Europe seeking aid and assistance in behalf of those "annoying" patriots and miscreants fighting for freedom and liberty in the far-away Colonies. It was Dr. Franklin's strong opinion that without the help of the French we might never had been victorious . . . isn't history great?

One extraordinary fact that Dr. Franklin shared concerned the story of his publication of *Poor Richard's Almanac* and its amazing success. Dr. Franklin pointed out that the Almanac actually outsold the Bible, but then reminded everyone in the room that it was probably because it had to be purchased every year!! What a clever man this Benjamin Franklin is.

He then shared an inspiring message of the importance to community involvement and the responsibility of every person's duty to service in behalf of their fellow man, woman and child.

Dr. Franklin's stories about his creation of the postal system and public library system were quite remarkable. Reflecting on his 81 years of life, he stated how he was continually bolstered by his belief in eternal optimism. Dr. Franklin also said he was glad to see that optimism was still alive and well.

The second half of the evening featured representatives from many of the presidential campaigns speaking in behalf of their candidates which resulted in a spirited session of Q & A. The evening then closed out with a straw poll conducted among all attendees. The results, in order of the number of votes received with the highest listed first, were:

Democrats: Obama, Clinton, Edwards, Kucinich.

Republicans: Paul, McCain, Giuliani, Thompson, Huckabee.

Dr. Franklin got some votes but had previously declared if elected he would not serve, unless it was tea. A good time was had by all.
