

Windows 7 & 8 computers AUTOMATICALLY getting Windows 10 Feb. 9th

Frank Middleton suggested that we share this message from a former member, Scott Henke, OnSite Consulting, regarding "How Microsoft has aggressively pushed Windows 10 to everyone."

Microsoft is going to automatically download, install and switch you from Windows 7 or 8 to Windows 10 starting Tuesday, February 9 unless you are prepared. Here's a news article and another.

They are changing Windows 10 from an "OPTIONAL" update where you have to intentionally click it, to a "RECOMMENDED" update which is usually installed automatically.

Though Windows 10 itself is stable, problems occur with all the NON-Microsoft software and hardware attached to your system including:

- Monitor Not Working
- USB Ports Not Working

- Wireless and Network Not Working
- Quicken and QuickBooks Not Working
- Printer Not Working; you have to buy a new \$5,000 office printer
- Automatically sharing your Wi-Fi access with all your contacts
- Not to mention it doesn't look or feel like your old Windows 7/8

We foresee this as a major, worldwide issue. All we can do is to protect our 7,000+ customers as best as we can.

Windows 8 is VERY similar to Windows 10, so we don't think the update will be a problem at all. In fact, it is easier than Windows 8.

We KNOW you can do the change yourself.

You need to change your update settings by unchecking "Give me Recommended Updates".


