Steve Martinez, Branch Manager, Owen Branch Boys & Girls Club

ponlie Smith introduced our speaker today Steve Martinez, Branch Manager for the J. Churchill Owen Branch of the Boys and Girls Club. The Owen Boys & Girls Club serves the Westwood neighborhood in west Denver. Owen Boys & Girls Club was the first Denver-area Boys & Girls Club built specifically for that purpose. It bears the name of J. Churchill Owen, who was instrumental in establishing the Boys & Girls Clubs of Metro Denver in 1961. The

Club is home to the large Andrés "Big Cat" Galarraga multipurpose field (named after the former Colorado Rockies first baseman), used for sports programs for all metro area Boys & Girls Clubs.

Boys & Girls Clubs provide young people with opportunities to engage in programs that help them achieve academic success, take charge of their health by building healthy habits that will stick with them throughout their lives, and foster the skills they need to become leaders in their communities.

According to Steve, the Owen branch serves 100+ kids every day, with various activities, ranging from sports, art, tutoring in all school subjects and leadership training. With a staff of six full-time and six half-time employees, there is about a 1:15 of employees to participants, who range in age



from 6-18 years. Both boys and girls participate in all activities. Cost to participate in these activities is \$2/ year.

An emphasis is placed on STEM or science, technology, engineering and math. Jessie Cardenas, who is a former participant at the Owen Branch, is a graduate of Florida State University School of Engineering, but chooses to work with the Owen Branch kids to develop future engineers and scientists.

Overall there are 17 different sites in the Denver Metro Area, serving more than 2000 kids per day. In addition to the various activities, a healthy, nutritious meal is served every day. In many cases, this may be the only meal the participants may get. Meals are furnished in cooperation with the Metro Food Bank.

Steve thanked the club members for the annual Thanksgiving dinner sponsored by Monaco South and Tamarac Optimist clubs, at which a full turkey dinner is served to over 600 people, including Boys and Girls Club members and their families and said he is looking forward to this year's dinner, which will be held Tuesday, November 24.
