

Also sign up online or by phone to the trailer—see below. DO NOT JUST SHOW UP; the managers need to know in advance who and how many are coming for each shift. Curt Jefferies will print address post cards for mailing to previous customers. The newsletter staff will mail the post cards.

Complete four (4) shifts and receive a tree at cost. Next Friday, November 25th, is set-up day and some sales. Saturday, November 26th, is the first official day of sales.

Bryce Slaby did an excellent job of painting the trailer a vibrant white and the wheels black. Cheerleaders from



George Washington HS and ROTC members from Thomas Jefferson HS will augment our sales people. The ladies of Tamarac Optimist Club will graciously do the pricing of the trees. There will be a chili cookoff, details later. Santa's will be available for pic-

Online Sign-up

- 1. Log into the MSOC site at: http://www.monacosouth.org
- 2. Click on the "Members Only" link on the left side of the page
- 3. Click on "Christmas Tree Lot" Schedule
 Enter User Name: msoctrees
 Enter Password: xmas2011 (Note: User Name & password are
 case sensitive don't enter any capitals)
- 4. Click on the magnifying glass in one of the calendar days to see the contents of a day. When you do this you are taken to a box that shows the 4 shifts for that day and the staffing level (number of workers needed for each shift). M-Th shifts require 3 workers, Friday requires 4 and weekends vary according to time of day—busy times on Sat. and Sun. need as many as10.
- 5. Click on pencil icon in one of the calendar days to add name (or edit) to a shift on that day. When you are done adding (or editing) click on "SAVE" at bottom to save changes. You can click on "View Week" in the left column of the calendar to see the sign-ups for the whole week. You can click on "View Weekend" to see the sign-ups for the weekend only.

The calendar was created by webmaster, **Paul Bernard** and is very easy to use. Thanks Paul!
