



Our Speakers Ken Broermann and Linda Fuller Aurora Youth Options

Paul Bernard introduces our speaker this morning. Ken Broermann, Mentor Program Coordinator,



and <u>Linda Fuller</u>, Mentor Specialist, are here this morning from Aurora Youth Options (AYO) looking for mentor material. AYO works with middle and high

school-aged youth and their families to navigate, connect and provide positive, individualized resources to help youth thrive.

Ken played a short video that showed the impact these mentors make. A high school aged young man told his story of how his life had been turned around by his mentor. The adult mentor recalled his story of growing up and making poor decisions without the guidance of a positive role model. His attempt to give back and support is the spark that the high schooler needed and one that continues to provide him the path to success, in life and in school.

Ken talked about what a mentor means to AYO, a caring adult friend who they need to listen and offer support. What young person growing up with little opportunity for that in their world would not thrive with positive reinforcement and a nurturing environment? Ken is looking to add 20 Mentors in the coming year, with most of that being a male mentor. He has come to look for a few good men and any interested members are asked to contact Ken directly.

The time needed for this program is only two meetings per month and these meetings can be as simple as taking a young man fishing, to the park, showing him your stamp collecting, or anything else you enjoy in your recreation time. Therefore, if this idea appeals to you and you have time to change a life, consider Aurora Youth Options, and make an impact on a young man in our community. Math Teacher Arrested At JFK Airport. Suspected Of Belonging To Secret Terror Society
