#### Invocation and Pledge



Jill Lysengen, Volunteer and Outreach Coordinator with the Rocky Mountain Chapter of the Arthritis Foundation, gave us information on various types of arthritis; there are 100 different types! Most common are Osteoarthritis (pain, swelling and stiffness of joints), fibromyalqia (pain
