Invocation and Pledge


George Vassilaros gave the invocation and led us in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.


Steve Kady in turn recognized **Frank Ross** for providing some of the entertainment at the party.

Paul Bernard led us in the Optimist Creed as the last meeting in January 2010 came to a close.


