## **OPTIMIST CLUB OF MONACO SOUTH PROJECTS AND ACTIVITIES**

The following describes the various youth, community service, and organizational projects that your Monaco South Optimist Club (a non-profit 501(c)4) sponsors and/or actively participates in running. This list is not all-inclusive, since we actively encourage our members to create or find new projects in which to get involved.

### **YOUTH PROJECTS--OUR PRIMARY MISSION**

#### **SUPER CITIZEN (Our Premier Service Project)**

Our Club presents **Super Citizen Awards** for outstanding citizenship at McMeen, Samuels, Bradley, Holm, Most Precious Blood, Hamilton MS, Lowry, and Slavens schools. At the elementary schools, at one or two assemblies during the school day, a Monaco South member presents each **SUPER CITIZEN** with a framed certificate signed by our Club President, Denver's Chief of Police and Mayor, and a T-shirt proclaiming them to be Super Citizens at that school, and a letter from the Governor. Photos are taken of each child with his/her parent and/or teacher. At Hamilton Middle School, Monaco South presents the awards during the evening at gathering of the award winners, their families, their teachers, and Hamilton's school administration

#### **BRAIN BOWL**

The Brain Bowl is similar to the old GE College Bowl TV show (for those too young to remember, think Jeopardy with teams), but for middle school kids. Three competitions go on at the same time: one for 6th grade, one for 7th grade, and one for 8th grade. Teams take a written test and engage in verbal rounds against other teams which test their general knowledge. The teams surviving the preliminary rounds of competition then face head-to-head single elimination in verbal competition rounds until the champions are determined at each grade level.

In January and February, the Brain Bowl hosts over 160 competing teams in three tournaments located in Westminster, Littleton, and Colorado Springs. Teams come from all around the state, and the assistance of 30 other Optimist Clubs throughout the Colorado-Wyoming District is necessary to put on the event. ### **COLORADO HISTORY DAY**

Middle school and high school students write papers, assemble displays, produce documentaries, or write and perform original live performances related to the year's official theme. Monaco South members serve as judges (except for the papers) at the Denver Region History Day event and at Colorado History Day held at the University of Colorado at Denver, on the Auraria Campus. ### **CHILDHOOD CANCER CAMPAIGN**

Monaco South supports research into the causes and prevention of Childhood Cancer and assists children and their families who are undergoing treatment. Each year, one dollar from each Christmas tree sold is donated to a cause that aids the prevention of cancer or treatment of children with cancer. This can amount to \$1200 or more! In addition, we occasionally conduct "Happy Bucks" where members can brag on or report happy events in their life and put cash in the pot for the CCC. Often the District holds a casino night to also raise funds for CCC, and this is a lot of fun.

### **EAGLE SCOUT RECOGNITION DINNER**

At the Denver Area Council's Annual Eagle Scout Recognition Dinner in March, the President of Monaco South makes the award presentations for the outstanding Eagle Service Projects for the current class of Eagle Scouts in the Council. The awards are for each Scout District and the Council at large. The award for the Council winner is a \$ 1,000 gift from Monaco South. The dinner is arranged by the Council and hundreds are in attendance, with a special keynote speaker and numerous other special awards made by the Council or the Eagle Scout Association. Monaco South sponsors a table at the dinner for a donation of \$ 1,000.

### **ESSAY CONTEST**

This event is sponsored by Optimist International, and it awards scholarships to high school students. ### **OPTIMIST INTERNATIONAL FOUNDATION**

Established in 1971, the Optimist International Foundation (OIF) is a not-for-profit 501(c)(3) charitable organization. OIF works with Optimist Clubs located in over 3,800 communities in the United States, Canada, Europe and the Caribbean. A majority of support received by the Optimist International Foundation is unrestricted. These donations are applied to the annual campaign, and are used to support the Oratorical Contest, Communications Contest for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing (CCDHH) and Essay Contest scholarships, as well as the Junior Optimist Octagon International program (JOOI). OIF is a major contributor to research at Johns Hopkins to help find cures for childhood cancer. In addition to the annual club donation of about \$5 per member, individual members are encouraged to give tax-deductible donations, either to OIF, especially through the Dime-A-Day program, or to the club through the OIF Passthrough program

### **TRI-STAR BASKETBALL**

This activity is a key program from Optimist International. Volunteers from our club are needed to schedule this one-hour basketball skills competition, to recruit participants and to officiate at the events. ### **BILL WALTERS MEMORIAL BOYS & GIRLS CLUBS THANKSGIVING DINNER**

Run for many years by deceased member, Bill Walters, as it has for the past 35 years, Thanksgiving comes early for about 1000 boys and girls (and their families) at the Boys & Girls Clubs of Metro Denver and at Girls, Inc of Metro Denver. Members of the Optimist Club of South Monaco serve turkey - about 800 pounds of it - and all the trimmings at two locations on the Tuesday before Thanksgiving. Kids are bused in from most of the metro area Boys and Girls Clubs to get to the location of the dinner, which for many would be the only Thanksgiving dinner they would have. Some bring their siblings and parents, and many take advantage of the "to go" boxes to take turkey, gravy, mashed potatoes and pumpkin pie to the folks back home who can't come. Monaco South purchases the food, which is prepared by a local catering operation for free. As they have for over two decades, Monaco South club members have a wonderful time serving the food to the noisy crowd.

### **CHRISTMAS BASKETS & GIFTS**

The Christmas Baskets & Gifts Project is an offshoot of the Thanksgiving Basket Project which was started in the 1980's. This project was expanded in the 1990's to include furnishing fixings for a full Christmas Dinner and usually some toys to needy families with children in the elementary schools where we sponsor Super Citizen Programs.

The Committee Chairman for Monaco South starts a sign-up sheet about a month before the event (which is always the Saturday before Christmas). The Chairman makes arrangements with various food sources for the essential ingredients of a Christmas Dinner. The Club pays for these items, but we try to get grocery stores to give us a discount price on the food & foil pans that we buy.

Early in the morning on the Saturday that we deliver the food baskets, several members of the club will meet to pick up the food and take it to the designated spot for assembling the food boxes for each family. At a designated time, the rest of the members who have signed up to work this project will meet at the assembly area and box up the food for delivery.

The Christmas Gifts, for the children of six families in each school are purchased by Monaco South with budgeted funds and by other benefactors. The Social Services representative at the schools gives us a list of the names, gender and ages of each child. Club members will then deliver the food baskets and gifts to the designated families.

The total time of assembling and delivering the food baskets and gifts is about 2 hours.

### **THANKSGIVING BASKETS**

This project is identical to the Christmas basket project, but without the toys. We usually deliver 40+ full meal food baskets.

### **ORATORICAL CONTEST**

The Optimist Oratorical Contest gives youngsters the chance to speak to the world. More than \$150,000 in college scholarships funded by the Optimist International Foundations is awarded annually from this program. First conducted in 1928, this is the second most popular Optimist International Program. Nearly 2,000 clubs participate in this program each year. The winners at the Club level receive medallions and Zone winners receive a plaque. Districts have the opportunity to provide a first-place scholarship of \$2,500, a second-place scholarship of \$1,500, and a third-place scholarship of

The topic for the 2018-19 Optimist International Oratorical Contest is: "Is There a Fine Line Between Optimism and Reality?"

Who: Youth under the age of 19 as of October 1, 2018 (and is not enrolled as a degree seeking student of a post-secondary institution) in the United States, Canada or the Caribbean. There is no minimum age.

How To Enter: Interested students submit a speech on the pre-assigned topic to their local Optimist Club.

The deadline to enter is determined by the sponsoring Optimist Club. All Club-level contests are typically held by late March.

The District deadline to submit winners to Optimist International is May 15, 2019. Optimist International does not set Club/Zone/Regional deadlines.

### **JUNIOR GOLF**

As a major program of Optimist International, Monaco South members help with the three CO/WY District Junior Golf Qualifiers. We provide 15 or more people to help run the District Qualifiers in conjunction with the Junior Golf Alliance of Colorado. Our club raises about \$ 45,000 to help send 60+ kids to THE OPTIMIST each year. Members are welcome to sponsor holes for the District Qualifiers and to participate in the Adult Golf Fundraiser Scramble.
