Installation Banquet

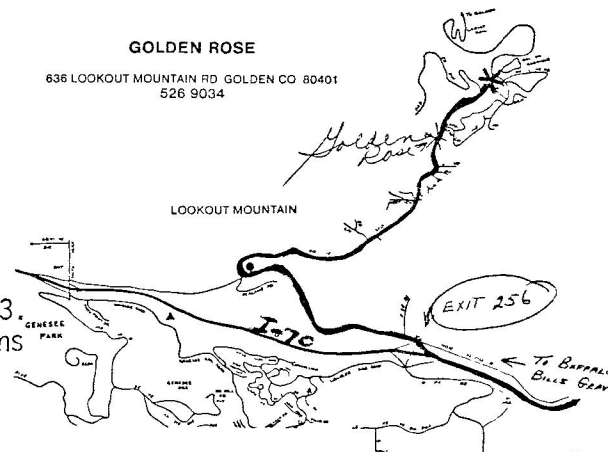
